## <u>ORDINANCE NO. 035-2020 – Draft # 1</u> AUTHORIZING ADOPTION OF THE MAY 2020 REPLACEMENT PAGES TO THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WHITEHALL, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
