WHITEHALL CITY COUNCIL MEETING

MINUTES – JUNE 20, 2017

Council President Jim Graham called the regular meeting of Whitehall City Council to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 20, 2017.

At President Graham's request, everyone rose for a moment of silence. The Pledge of Allegiance was then recited by those assembled.

On roll call by the clerk, the following members of council were present:

EXCUSE ABSENT MEMBERS

Mr. Bailey moved to excuse the absent member and Mr. Kantor seconded the motion. There was no discussion. On a roll call vote, the six present members responded in the affirmative and Ms. Conison was excused.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Kantor moved to approve the Minutes of the June 6, 2017 agenda and regular meetings. Mr. Bailey seconded the motion. There was no discussion. On a roll call vote, the six present members responded in the affirmative and the Minutes were approved as submitted.

POLL PUBLIC

Jean Arms, 4010 Etna St., said she was here because she just found out about the proposal of replacing the traffic lights with stop signs by the schools. She said she feels that the city should have informed the public on what they were proposing. Her home is where the crosswalk is on Beechwood Road and she said she sees people drive through the traffic lights now. She doesn't feel people would like to have to stop 24 hours day each time they go down that street. She stated that she is concerned about the safety of the children. She said someone needed to check with the school secretaries and the people that are in charge of the safety patrol for those schools to get their opinion on the change. She commented that she knows that it was discussed with the School Board, but they are not the ones on the streets.

Tammy Turner, 1041 Shady Lane Rd., said she is talking in reference to Ordinance 053-2017, which involves the parking on Shady Lane Rd. She explained that the bar across the street has two to three events a month with as many as 200 people. They are parking up and down the road and at the end of resident's yards. She said it has become dangerous and she is in favor of this ordinance that will prohibit parking on both sides of the road. She stated that a lot of neighbors are for this ordinance, but they are elderly and do not have computer access. She has urged them to give Mr. Morrison a call. She said she hopes that council will find in favor of this ordinance. She thanked Mr. Morrison for helping with this situation.

Josue' Vicente, Executive Director for the Ohio Hispanic Coalition, 5398 Contimary Court, Westerville, said he is here because he operates a Cultural Educational Center at 205 N. Hamilton Rd. He said by zoning it is a Limited Commerce District. When he filed for the Occupancy permit it was refused because a Cultural Educational Center was not a permitted use in the zoning area. He read the description of General Commerce District which says permit uses are all uses that are permitted in the Limited Commerce District. He said he feels that it is clear that this use should be permitted and maybe it is a misinterpretation. He is asking City Council to guide him in the right direction so he can solve this situation.

City Attorney Michael Bivens – reported that since they started the Urban League Diversion Program they have had 103 people go through the program and 60 successfully completed the program. He shared a rule called 10 for 10 which means each individual has the ability to impact at least 10 people in their life. He said if we took the 10 for 10 model imagine how many people we could impact over the years with the small things we are doing in Mayors Court by getting them jobs and helping them with alcohol and drug addiction. He thanked the mayor for the recent training they had and said it was about what we can measure and he thinks our small city is making an impact with Central Ohio on what we are trying to do with these individuals. Lastly, he gave his condolences to Detective Spezialetti on the death of his father.

PUBLIC HEARING

Marc Nolan, 4106 E Main Street, came forward and explained that he is asking permission to expand his current business located at 4106 E. Main St. He explained that he has decided to expand his business in Whitehall and close his business in Lancaster.

Mr. Bailey asked if the two buildings were attached. Mr. Nolan said yes. He said you can walk from one building to the other. He stated that his plans are to upgrade the building once he gets permission from council.

Mr. Kantor commented that it is a really clean and great business and that Mr. Nolan is doing a great job.

Resident Tammy Turner, 1041 Shady Lane Road, said she is a Harley rider and she is all for the expansion of this business.

Tammy Turner, 1041 Shady Lane Rd., stated she has talked many times to the Columbus and Whitehall Police Departments, City Prosecutor and Code Enforcement about the bar that is at 1024 Shady Lane Road. She said the problems include the amount of people, noise, traffic and cars. She said that she hopes when the liquor license comes up in January it will be denied. She stated that this neighborhood has never been like this in 25 years and they are working to make it better.

COMMUNITY DATE BOARD

Mr. Stahley said that the pageants are this Saturday 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at Rosemore Middle School in the auditorium. He said Mayor Maggard will be judging some of the pageants.

Auditor Miller said there is a car show July 2 at the VFW at 10:00 a.m. Mr. Kantor said this Sunday is Music in the Park with A.J. Angelo. There will also be bounce houses and "Family Fun Night" starting at 6:00 p.m. at Bishop Park. Mr. Stahley said that they will also have snow cones.

POLL COUNCIL

Mr. Kantor thanked everyone for coming. He said he knows it is hard to come up in front of council and talk on any subject. He thanked Ms. Arms for sharing her concerns. He said he has talked to School Board and Administration regarding this ordinance. He said this ordinance is currently up for two readings, but he is going to ask for three readings so maybe more people can give their opinion. He said that council does listen to the concerns of the community and that this is a really good group of people including administration. Mr. Morrison thanked everyone for coming and said it is always nice having a good crowd. He said he appreciates Mr. Nolan and his business and Ms. Turner and Mary Ann for their input regarding the Shady Lane issue. He wished everyone a good week.

Mr. Bailey thanked everyone for coming and said to the previous councilman that had just spoken "well said".

Mr. Rodriguez said it was good to see Mr. and Mrs. Arms out and about. He said the Armes are wonderful people and have been a part of making Whitehall what it is today. He said we should all be thankful to have them in Whitehall. He congratulated Mr. Nolan for the expansion of his business.

Mr. Gregg thanked everyone coming and ditto on what everyone else said.

President Graham thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and said he hopes to see everyone back at the next meeting.

Having nothing further, Mr. Bailey moved to adjourn and Mr. Rodriguez seconded the motion. On a roll call vote, the six present members responded in the affirmative and the meeting adjourned at 7:44 p.m.
