Compliance Overview of Chapter 505, Codified Ordinances of the City of Whitehall Titled "Animals" as it pertains to Dangerous and Vicious Dogs

Hearing, Determination and Appeal Process

If the City becomes aware that a dog has been involved in an incident that could result in a determination that the dog is either a dangerous or vicious dog, it shall conduct a hearing to make such a determination.

If the City becomes aware that a dog is a vicious dog as declared by the Ohio Revised Code, it shall conduct a hearing to make such a determination.

The hearing shall be conducted upon notice to the dog's owner, keeper or harborer.

The hearing notice shall be provided in writing at least 5 days in advance of the hearing.

The hearing shall be conducted before the Dangerous and Vicious Dog Appeals Board.

The dog's owner, keeper or harborer shall have the opportunity to present information to the Board in support of their contention that the dog is not dangerous or vicious.

The dog's owner, keeper or harborer who fails respond to the notice or appear at the hearing is deemed to have waived the right to a hearing.

Within 15 days of the close of the hearing, the hearing officer shall issue the Board's determination to the dog's owner, keeper or harborer.

The dog's owner, keeper or harborer shall be responsible for the hearing expenses.

Dangerous Dog

A declared dangerous dog, while outside but on its own premises, must be securely confined in a locked pen with a top, or locked in a yard with a six foot fence. The confinement must

- conspicuously display a dangerous dog sign;
- be humane and protect the dog from the elements;
- prevent the dog from escaping;
- prevent entry of young children and unauthorized public contact with the dog.

A declared dangerous dog, while off its premises, must be kept on a chain-link leash or tether with a fixed length of not more than 4 feet, as well as at least one of the following:

- keep the dog in a locked pen, locked fenced yard, or other locked enclosure 6 feet in height;
- have the leash or tether
 - controlled by a person 18 years of age or older and physically capable of controlling the dog, or
 - securely affixed to the ground or stationary object with said adult in close proximity to keep the dog from harming anyone or anything; or
- have the dog muzzled in accordance with the law.

For liability purposes, the owner of any residence or the tenant of any residence may be considered the owner/keeper or harborer of any **declared dangerous dog** that resides on the premises.

Vicious Dog

A declared vicious dog, while outside but on its premises, must be securely confined in a locked pen with a top, or locked in a yard with a six foot fence. The confinement must

- conspicuously display a vicious dog sign;
- be humane and protect the dog from the elements;
- prevent the dog from escaping;
- prevent entry of young children and unauthorized public contact with the dog.

A declared vicious dog, while off its premises, must be kept on a chain-link leash or tether with a fixed length of not more than 4 feet, as well as at least one of the following:

- keep the dog in a locked pen, locked fenced yard, or other locked enclosure 6 feet in height;
- have the leash or tether
 - controlled by a person 18 years of age or older and physically capable of controlling the dog, or
 - securely affixed to the ground or stationary object with said adult in close proximity to keep the dog from harming anyone or anything; or
- have the dog muzzled in accordance with the law; and
- when the dog is being transported in a vehicle, open bed truck or other conveyance, keep it
 confined in a locked crate or cage capable of preventing escape, and constructed so a child
 cannot penetrate the barricade with a hand, and posted with a sign stating 'vicious dog' in
 both symbols and words.

The owner, keeper or harborer of a declared vicious dog must

- obtain a \$100,000.00 liability insurance policy to cover damage, bodily injury or death of a person caused by said vicious dog;
- have a veterinarian insert a uniquely identifying microchip into the dog;

- provide documentation from the veterinarian describing the information on the microchip to the City's Division of Police;
- provide the microchip information within 30 days of the Board's declaration unless an appeal is filed with the Board and a stay of this requirement is granted;
- provide identifying photos of the dog to the City's Division of Police;
- have the dog spayed or neutered within 30 days of notice of the Board's declaration;
- provide proof of the spaying or neutering to the City's Division of Police;
- notify the City's Division of Police if the dog has attacked any person;
- within 10 days of transfer of ownership of the dog, obtain a free transfer form from Franklin County Animal Control, complete said form, and furnish a copy to the transferee, to the board of health district in which the transferee resides, and to the dog warden of the county in which the transferee resides.

For liability purposes, the owner of any residence or the tenant of any residence may be considered the owner/keeper or harborer of any declared vicious dog that resides on the premise.

<u>Please note:</u> This Overview is not all encompassing. It's intended to provide a brief summary of the requirements for dangerous and vicious dogs. Please acquire copies of the below listed ordinances from the City Council Clerk to view the entire law pertaining to dangerous and vicious dogs and zoning requirements. Criminal penalties attach to most of these requirements.

Whitehall Codified Ordinance sections 505.14, 505.15 and 1125.06
