

#### Water access

Onsite water for dogs
Water faucet and hose to wash and cool dogs
Dog water fountains
Will there be a watering station
Water faucets in 2 to 3 different areas

#### Drainage and surfacing

Pea gravel at entrance/ high traffic areas
Make sure there is good drainage so it is not muddy after a light rain
Mulch instead of gravel. Gravel can hurt paws and get hot in the summer
Consider that dog parks with poor drainage get muddy and are not fun

#### Seating

Places for people to sit
Place benches in scattered areas of the park to prevent too much socializing and not enough dog supervision
Common areas for owners to sit and chat
Covered sitting area

#### Dog waste and disposal

How will you counter dog urine
A place for bags/ dog waste. Will there be multiple trash cans
Bag dispensary in both large and small dog sections. Multiple waste disposal cans
In-ground dog waste collection system

#### Gates and layout

Bullpen gate latches should be easy to use. Bullpen entrances should be smaller than displayed in the "concept" layout
Will there be controlled entry/ exit
Separate small and large dog sections
An area for older dogs and residents

#### Supervision and safety

Will the park be monitored? Will there be a schedule/ hours?
Park maintenance presence near park so users maintain the facility
Safety issues. Places to hide, kids hanging out, etc.

#### Shade

Balance of shade trees and open space to throw/ catch balls and frisbees
More than one shady spot spread out from each other
Natural shade is very important, especially for dark colored dogs in the summer

#### Agility features

Agility/ training equipment for dogs
A-frame, tunnels, jumps for agility

#### Fencing

Fencing at an adequate height
Barriers/ privacy fence surrounding the park

#### Trees

Please retain the tall fir trees at the corner of Beechwood
Clear the rest of Washburn

#### Location

Put in Whitehall Community Park
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#### Noise

How will noise/ barking levels be kept to a minimum
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
