## MYTH

All panhandlers are poor and have no source of income.

## FACT

The majority of panhandlers have some source of income. Numerous panhandlers have worked for pay in the last month and/or received income from family or friends. Many receive monthly benefits and/or income from the Social Security Administration, Veterans Administration, Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and other federal, state and local entities.

## HTYM

Panhandlers have no place to live or sleep.

## FACT

Panhandlers are often not homeless. For those individuals who are, emergency shelter is available. Some individuals also have the option of living with family or friends.

## HTYM

Panhandlers have no food and no means to get a meal.

## FACT

Faith Mission, Holy Family Church, and numerous other organizations provide free meals to individuals who are in need. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are available 365 days of the year.

## HTYM

Panhandlers use the money they collect for food and shelter.

## FACT

In most cases, the money collected by panhandlers is used to support a drug, alcohol or gambling addiction.

Aggressive panhandling is illegal. It involves begging with the intent to intimidate another person into giving money or valuables. If you feel you have been aggressively panhandled, contact the Division of Police immediately.



- No parking lots
- 25 feet of an outdoor patio
- 25 feet of a bank or check-cashing business entrance
- 25 feet of an ATM machine
- A bus shelter and 10 feet beyond its walls
- 20 feet of bus stop sign where no shelter exists
- · 25 feet of a drive through window
- 15 feet of a pay telephone
- · No right-of-way

ANY verbal panhandling is considered aggressive.
